Emmanuel: God With Us

There's nothing quite like settling down to watch a good film during the Christmas season. Recently, I rewatched the classic Home Alone—the highest-grossing Christmas film for nearly 30 years. As I reflected on its success, beyond the great comedy, one thing stood out: how powerfully it captures the universal feeling of being alone. When that feeling is experienced as a child, it can be especially painful.

For many of us, Christmas is a time when loneliness feels distant, as we spend time surrounded by family and loved ones. However, for some of the young people we work with, it can be the opposite. The season can highlight feelings of isolation. Even when they are not physically alone, they may feel alone in their circumstances—dreading conversations about presents or questions about what they'll be doing over Christmas.

It is such a blessing, especially in the build-up to Christmas, to be able to offer safe and welcoming spaces where young people are valued simply for who they are and can grow in confidence. But more than that, we get to share the hope we have—that they never have to face life alone. We believe in a God who is not distant or far away, but One who loved us so much that He stepped into our world to be with us—then, now, and forever.


